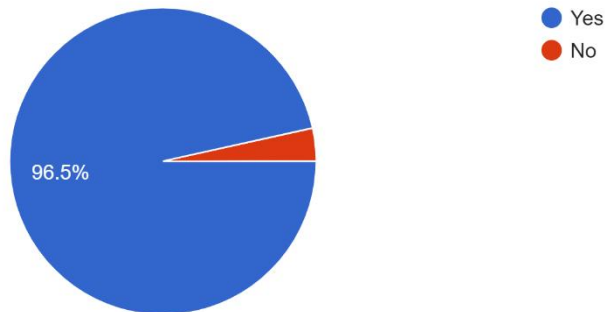


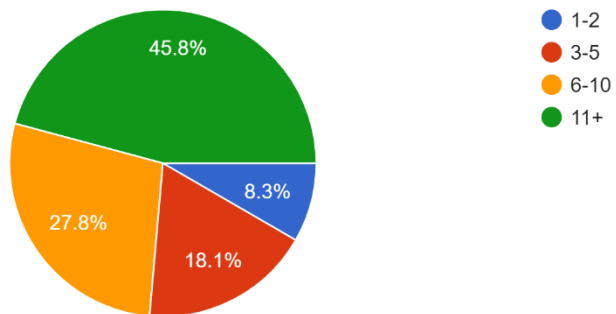

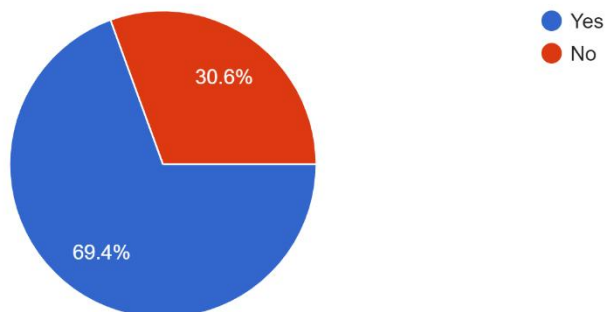
How many times per year do you visit Charlotte Beach?

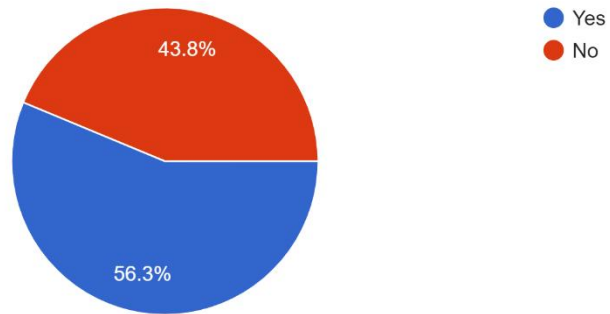
Did you buy a season pass?

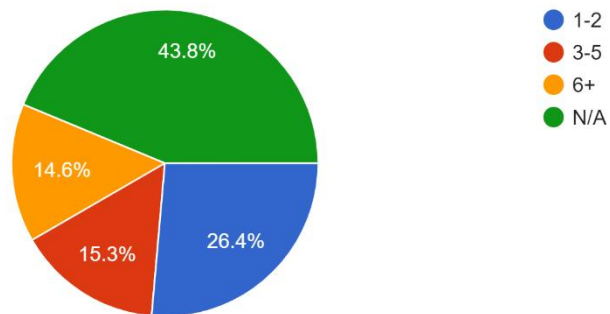
Have you ever used the bathhouse?

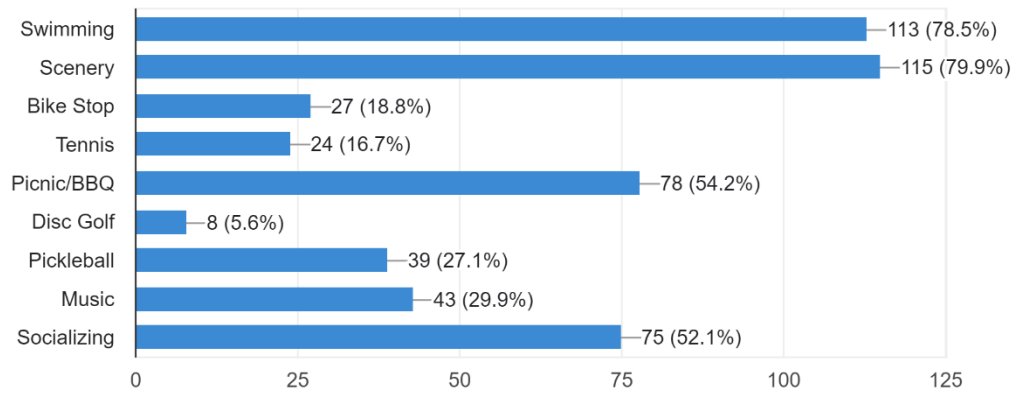
If yes, how often per season?

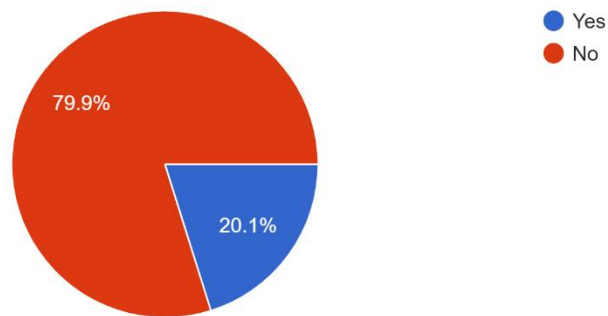
Why do you come to Charlotte Beach?

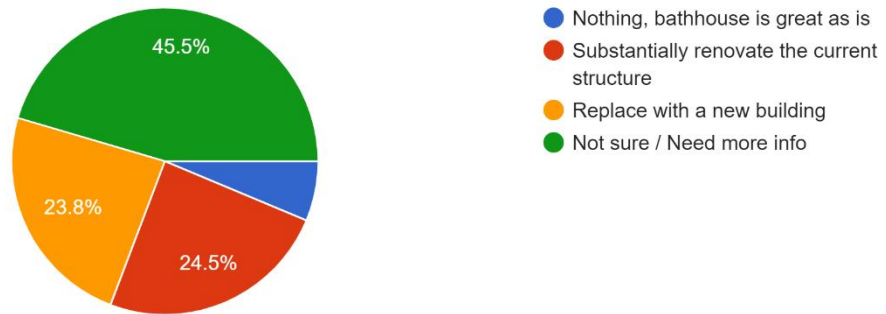
Would you personally benefit from ADA-accessible facilities?

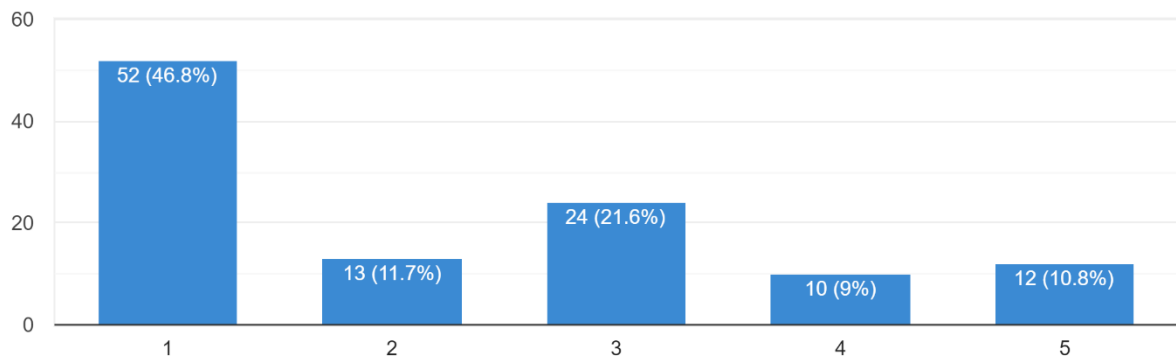
What do you think should happen to the current bathhouse?

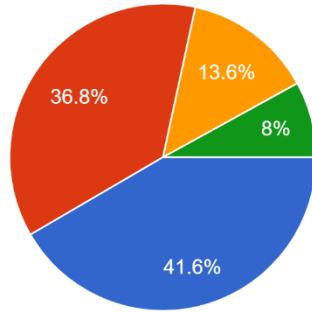
How important is keeping the current location and footprint of the existing bathhouse?

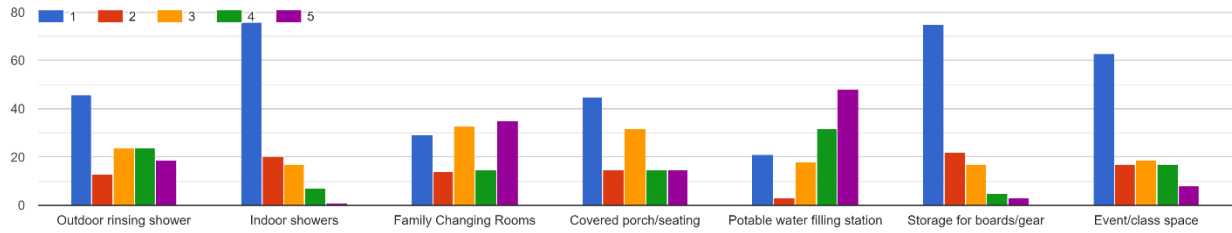
What scale of bathhouse would you prefer?

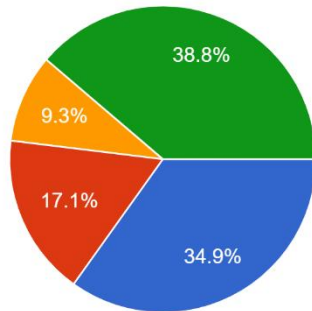

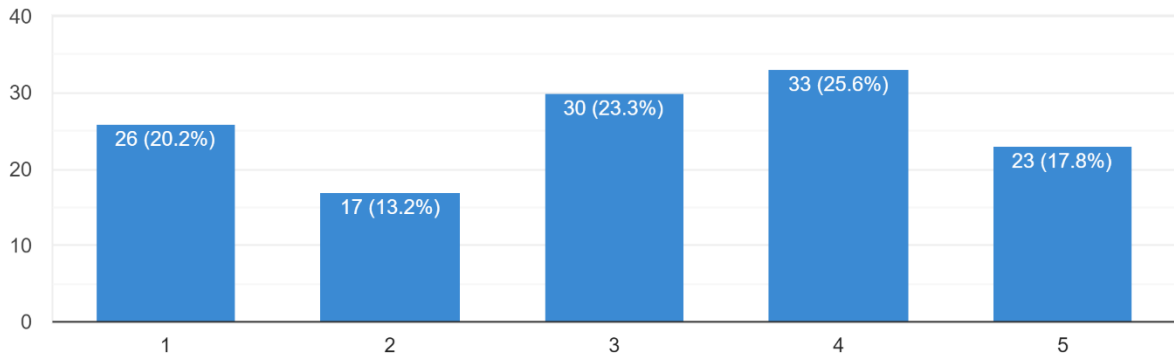
Which best represents your funding preference?

I am not sure what the fix is for this, but a few years ago I was at the playground with my children when another smaller child (toddler-ish) fell while climbing, but their leg got caught between two metal playground supports and the child was dangling upside down. Accidents happen. I knew who the child's mother was and that she would not be able to get to her child in that location as she is wheelchair-bound so I obviously removed the child from their stuck-dangling position and brought her to her mother. The part of this that bothers me is that I regularly see this wheelchair-using mother trying to navigate many of the public places of our town and it is a real struggle. Wheeling through grass, through playground mulch, trying to get to openings in the curbs around the playground structure. Not to mention no way for her to get down to the beach to play with her kids or swim. ADA compliance means including all people in accessing our wonderful shared spaces.

It's fine, however the stairs are not great. The "beach" is not really accessible for all.

Tennis courts without cracks

Consideration needs to go into safety and security at the beach. As an adjoining property owner, nothing has been done by the town or recreation committee to curb year round use, late night parties and overnight parking. A gate has been suggested but hasn't been pursued due to funds and personnel to open and close the gate. I'm not against renovating the bathhouse in a reasonably cost affordable way, but it the security and safety price needs to be addressed first.

Maybe Charlotte should work harder on a plan to gate or fence off the parking area to prevent unwanted use when the park/beach are closed. Asking neigh to call the state police when the current rules are being violated is not the solution. Please listen to your

Charlotters who continue to express a need for a gate when the property is technically closed.
